The 2007-2008 executive of the Listowel School of Dance is pleased to conclude another successful year. There were 100 dancers registered and the new studio space was well utilized with ballet and modern theatre dance lessons. Our Senior Artistic Director, Miss Jane Gibbon, is fully certified with the Royal Academy of Dance and an alumnus of our own school. Miss Ashley Mueller taught the modern classes and was the Director of our two companies. We also had two senior students, Miss Sarina Annis and Miss Madeline Kerr teaching some of the junior ballet classes.



We offer congratulations to the 23 students who took their Royal Academy of Dance examinations, Grade 1- Advanced 1, and all passed with very strong results. It was exciting to be able to offer most of these exams in our own studio.

Our two performance companies, Spectrum (senior, 4 members) and Kaleidoscope (junior, 5 members) had a very busy year dancing at various venues including tours of local elementary schools and seniors' homes, Health Care Heroes Radiothon, Christmas Wish Dinner, Lions Club Christmas Celebration, and the LMH Cradle Club.

In addition, each dancer had the opportunity to show what they have learned at the biannual demonstrations at Christmas and spring. This is always a special treat for parents, grandparents and friends!

Another highlight was the visit by Ballet Jorgen during which time students participated in workshops, master classes and were able to watch a special performance.

Parent participation is vital to the Listowel School of Dance which is entirely run by volunteers, and 100% funded by dance fees and fundraising.

#### North Derth Darks and Dec needs input

Amy Gangl, Recreation Program Co-ordinator for the North Perth Parks and Recreation Department, is seeking information to help with an application to have North Perth registered as a Youth Friendly Community, through Play Works.

Play Works, the Ontario Partnership for Active Youth, is a group of organizations concerned about the future of our youth. It represents areas of sport, physical activity, civic engagement, arts and culture, rural youth, and recreation. The objective is to bring back the power of play to Ontario youth. The organization is dedicated to advancing this objective on local and provincial public and political agendas.

The group is concerned that places to play are becoming less accessible to youth; cutbacks mean fewer activities for youth; unsupervised activities for youth are risky; and volunteers and leaders are ready to burn out. This means less participation, which can mean more crime, drug use, loitering, and an increase in childhood obesity.

Amy is asking the community to advise her about any activities that support, involve, or speak on behalf of our youth, in preparation for her application. Two copies of any brochure/letter/document promoting such events are needed for the application. She would like these by early December.

## Artist Spotlight

### John Looser

When a serious back injury ended his career in new home construction six years ago, John Looser turned his passion for woodworking and art into a unique carpentry business that has inspired people around the world.

John builds enormous and creative birdhouses from reclaimed materials, primarily wood from old barns. The front yard of his farm property in Cranbrook, is devoted to a gallery displaying his work. His birdhouses range in size from sixteen inches tall to an astonishing nine feet wide and eight feet tall, some with log-house style construction, turrets and elaborate roof lines. John also builds rustic arbors from branches, playhouses, garden sheds, planter boxes and wooden waterfalls. He is always looking for new projects and new ideas to explore, especially if they mesh with his commitment to recycling and reusing materials.

John has two grown children and is relishing his

new role as grandpa to one-year-old Olivia. He loves the country life, and in his free moments he fixes muscle cars, collects antiques and pursues photography. Over the years he has also enjoyed the challenge of tending to sick animals; dogs, cats, and more recently, wild birds.

John's website, www.extremebirdhouse.com has introduced his art to the world, and he often receives emails from people who have been inspired to try woodworking for themselves.
