North Perth Arts and Culture Council is offering a two day Watercolour Workshop May 1 and 2, 2010, featuring visual artist Linda Bester. Both days will include demonstrations of watercolour painting techniques in Linda's unique style. Her clear and concise teaching methods make the workshop appealing to both the novice watercolourist as well as the more advanced painter. A Pleine Aire session is planned - weather permitting.

With her affinity for vibrant colour and her delicate attention to the play of light and shadow, Linda's paintings evoke a gentle, yet passionate perception of her surroundings. Whether that perception is inspired by the serenity and beauty of a crisp winter morning, or a startling depiction of a European streetscape, it is captured with the intention of being shared and enjoyed by others.

Linda is proficient in watercolour, oil, acrylic and pastel. Her subject matter is as varied as the world around her and combines natural and man-made elements in harmony with one another. A prolific and accomplished artist, her work can be found in many private and corporate collections worldwide.

Linda shares her talents through workshops with the Southampton Art School, The Blue Mountain School of Landscape Painting and through workshops and private lessons at the Bester Retreat Studio.

The workshop will take place May 1 and 2, from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm at the Listowel Golf Club. Lunch is included to ensure the artists' only concerns are painting, creating and having fun! Registration fee prior to April 7 is \$150; after that \$175. Cut off date is April 24th.

She says the affirmation she received from her church family at the Listowel Mennonite Church has significantly influenced her approach to music.

Becky currently attends the Canadian Mennonite University in Winnipeg, where she has nearly completed her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance and Music Ministry. She appreciates the school's emphasis on critical musical thought, which has helped her to focus on making her music significant and meaningful to herself and others. She is dedicated to performing music that has value and purpose. She enjoys performing for an audience, and also with other musicians. She was able to share what she has learned during her stint as an intern music and worship pastor at the Listowel Mennonite Church in the summer of 2009.

Becky has a wide variety of interests, including soccer and other sports. She enjoys learning about sustainable agriculture and is passionate about social justice. She relaxes by playing games and engaging in creative endeavours like sewing, knitting, dance and singing.

In the future Becky plans to pursue more opportunities to perform, teach and lead in worship. She has been exploring jazz, and is interested in performing in restaurants and at events. She is considering what to do following completion of her degree; whether to pursue further studies or worship learning opportunities, launch a professional music career or follow other interests.

Who's Doing What Now?

Sandy Van Cormviort (nee Coghlin)

Author of 'Meet the Farties'

Talking with Sandy, one gets the impression she has had an exuberant and fun loving spirit ever since she was a girl growing up on a farm just outside of Listowel. She always loved to dance, write songs, and tell funny stories. With a natural flare for the dramatic, Sandy recalls "When I was in a performing mood I would serenade the cows, horses and any other animals that happen to be in my sight. I know to this day the animals loved it!"

After graduating from Listowel District Secondary School, she attended Hairstyling School in London. This provided a career that brought great pleasure. Eventually Sandy returned to Listowel and opened a hairdressing shop in her home where she raised two daughters, Rhonda-Lee and Jennifer. Her love for fun instigated and encouraged lots of laughter with both her family and clients. Sandy knew someday she would be doing something that focussed on making people laugh.

Deciding to move on, after twenty-five years of hairdressing, she purchased her initial CURVES fitness centre in 2000 and went on to open four more in the area. She was directly involved with the operation of all. She remembers, in her Goderich location, "hooting and hollering in the centre of the work out-room to keep the ladies laughing." After eight years she sold her businesses.

During that time, her creative instinct was demanding to be released. In response, Sandy wrote a musical comedy for the stage. From that play, two locals artists, Mary Smith and Agnes Marie Henderson recorded one of her songs, 'Let's Fly' for Mary's 3rd CD. Sandy remembers, "I was so honoured and thrilled that my good friends liked it enough to record it."

Sandy's family inherited her unique sense of fun and became the inspiration for the book 'Meet The Farties'. Sandy describes it like this: "My little granddaughter, Skye-Blue, was visiting one day and said 'Watch out Grandma! Here comes.... Magnificent Mary!' and with that came a little toot. We laughed so hard and started making up more names, and then the family got involved and the real laughing began. I thought, 'If we have this much fun with this maybe others will too.' And the little 'Butt' family came to be. "



Sandy's material is never crude. 'Meet the Farties' is a book about a family of 'Butts', teaching manners about their gassy adventures. The book is loved by children and teachers are using it as an opportunity to help their students learn how to graciously handle one of those difficult challenges of life. This self published book was launched September 2009. Since then, Sandy has appeared on many radio programs and been featured in newspapers. The Fartie Lady, as she is known, recently did a story telling at the Waterloo Children's Museum in Kitchener. This is the first in a series of 10-15 books, as Sandy has over sixty little Butt characters to introduce. Her next book is about the little Butt who started it all, Magnificent Mary. Sandy is planning to add to the merriment of this whole theme by writing and introducing songs to go along with the Butt family tales.

'The Farties Ladies' (other than Sandy, the rest of the contingent remains a surprise) will be at the Bookery Café, 272 Main Street East, in Listowel, on March 13 at 3:00 pm, doing an animated reading of 'Meet the Farties'. Sandy will be signing books.
